## Five Titans Named to All-CCIW Softball Squad

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. — Jenny Miller of Illinois Wesleyan University was chosen as the league's "Player of the Year" and four other Titan softball players were also selected to the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin all-star squad in voting by league coaches today.

Miller, a junior third baseman from **Rock Island (HS)**, batted .511 in 14 CCIW games with four doubles, four home runs, and 23 runs batted in. She also had two triples and scored 17 runs.

Others named to the all-CCIW team are Sue Lammel, Robin Reed, Jennie Siron, and Jenny Schertz.

Lammel, a senior shortstop from **Evergreen Park (HS)**, was named to the CCIW all-star squad for the second consecutive year. She batted .297 with four doubles, 13 runs scored, and three stolen bases against conference foes this spring.

Reed, a junior outfielder from **Westmont (HS)**, led IWU in batting in league play with a mark of .541. She scored 13 runs, drove in 15 runs, and had a team-high five triples.

Siron, a sophomore pitcher from **Morris (HS)**, was 6-0 against league teams with a 1.08 earned run average. She struck out 47 batters and walked only 15 in 39 innings. As a batter, Siron hit .448 with four doubles and nine runs batted in.

Schertz, a freshman outfielder from **Metamora (Washington HS)**, batted .514 with two triples and a home run in 12 CCIW games. She scored 13 runs and stole four bases.

Wesleyan's Mandy Neal, who led the Titans to a 13-1 conference championship season, was chosen as the league's "Coach of the Year." She was named co-winner of the "Coach of the Year" honor for basketball last winter.

Illinois Wesleyan, founded in 1850, enrolls about 1,800 students in a College of Liberal Arts, College of Fine Arts, and a four-year professional School of Nursing. For the last five years, U.S.
