Illinois Wesleyan, founded in 1850, enrolls about 1,860 students in a College of Liberal Arts, College of Fine Arts, and a four-year professional School of Nursing. In recent years, the University's endowment has grown to more than \$100 million; a \$15 million athletics and recreation center opened in autumn 1994; and a \$24 million science building opened in October 1995. The Carnegie Commission for the Advancement of Teaching promoted IWU to a "baccalaureate I"

institution in 1994, a classification that places it among 161 highly selective national liberal arts colleges in the annual *U.S. News & World Report* rankings. *101 of the Best Values in America's Colleges and Universities* calls IWU "undoubtedly one of the finest small colleges in the country," adding, "Illinois Wesleyan has surged to national prominence on the basis of its reputation as a school with a rock-solid academic program."
