BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--Five bands--ranging from rock to reggae--will fill the Quadrangle at Illinois Wesleyan University with music, Saturday, Sept. 7, as part of the first annual Far Left Carnival.

Food, fun, and games will highlight the festival, which kicks off at 11 a.m. and runs to 9 p.m.

Musical acts are scheduled from 1-9 p.m.

Here's the line up of bands:

Activities will take place across the IWU Quad. Main stage musical acts will appear on "McPherson Beach," adjacent to the Quad side of McPherson Theatre.

The Far Left Carnival is presented by WESN, IWU's radio station, and IWU's Student Senate, Student Welfare and Human Resources Commission.
