### IWU Wind Ensemble to Perform, Feb. 21

BLOOMINGTON, III.--The Illinois Wesleyan University Wind Ensemble will perform in concert Friday, Feb. 21, at 7:30 p.m. in Westbrook Auditorium, Presser Hall, 303 E. University Ave.

The Wind Ensemble, under the direction of Steven W. Eggleston, IWU professor of music, will perform works by Grainger, Nixon, and Benson.

Other program highlights include "From a Dark Millennium" and the recently premiered "In Evening's Stillness" by Joseph Schwantner, a Pulitzer Prize-winning composer and two-time Grammy nominee who participated in IWU's Symposium of Contemporary Music on Jan. 28.

The concert is open to the public; admission is free.
