

Ecologist, Theologian to Speak at IWU, Oct. 22

BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--Ecologist and theologian Rosemary Radford Ruether will preach at Illinois Wesleyan University's Chapel Hour, Wednesday, Oct. 22 at 11 a.m. in Evelyn Chapel, 1301 N. Park St., Bloomington.

"Forgive Us Our Debts" is the title of her presentation.

Ruether is the Georgia Harkness Professor at the Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary and a member of the Graduate Faculty at Northwestern University in Evanston, Ill.

She is the author, editor, or co-editor of 30 books, including "An Ecofeminist Theology of Earth Healing" (1992) and "Women Healing Earth: Third World Women in Feminism, Religion, and Ecology" (1996).

Ruether is a columnist for the "Catholic Review" and a contributing editor to "The Egg: Ecojustice Quarterly," "The Journal of Religion and Intellectual Life," "Woman of Power," "Sojourners," and "Conscience."

She earned a bachelor of arts degree from Scripps College and master's and doctoral degrees from the Claremont Graduate School. She has been awarded 11 honorary degrees.
