## **Titan Law Club Sponsors "A DUI on You"**

On Thursday night, the Titan Law Club of Illinois Wesleyan University will give you a chance to be in the defendant's shoes as a mock trial about driving under the influence of alcohol (DUI) will be performed. Seven IWU students will be involved in its performance.
