The Math Society at Illinois Wesleyan University will hold its 4th annual Math Contest on Mar. 7, 1998 in the Center for Natural Science on the IWU Campus. Regional high school students are given a highly competitive math test in the morning, and winners of the contest awarded plaques and certificates in the afternoon. Past topics have included algebra, geometry, trigonometric functions, pre-calculus, calculus, probability, and discrete math.

This highly successful Math Contest had approximately 230 students from 12 high schools participate last year, with similar numbers expected to attend this year.
