Visiting Russian Musicians to Play at IWU

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. -- A special "Blue Moon-style" coffeehouse at Illinois Wesleyan University will feature a performance by a group of visiting musicians from Vladimir, Russia.

The group, which is sponsored by the Vladimir/Canterbury Sister City Association of Bloomington-Normal, will perform at 7:30 p.m. Monday, Nov. 16, in the Main Lounge of IWU's Memorial Student Center, 104 E. University. The program, which will feature works from Bach to the present, is free of charge and flavored coffees, teas and pastries will be available at a nominal cost.

The group, which has performed in the United Kingdom, Italy, and Germany, is composed of Masha Vlasova (accordion), Vasya Khorishev (boy soprano), Tatyana Savostianova (soprano) and Olga Panfilova (pianist).

During their visit, the group will also meet with a number of elementary, junior high and high schools in Bloomington-Normal.
