"We try to match up incoming and current students with mentors," explained Johnson, referring to a practical result from the picnic. "Student-alumni connections can lead to jobs and internships—and lifetime relations with people you otherwise might not know." Johnson introduced President Bill Clinton at a White House program in 1994, when legislation extending the Head Start pre-school education program was signed into law. Johnson was a member of the first Head Start class in 1965. Also participating in the ceremony marking Head Start's 29th birthday were First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, Vice President and Mrs. Al Gore, and Secretary of Health and Human Services Donna Shalala. Johnson received IWU's Robert M. Montgomery Outstanding Young Alumnus Award in 1994.
