BLOOMINGTON, Ill. -- Two new exhibitions featuring mixed media, paintings, and sculpture begin Nov. 4 at the Illinois Wesleyan University art galleries.

"Separate Structures - Works on Paper by Jan Kemmerling, Moritz Kellerman, and Brian Sikes" will be on display in the Merwin Gallery through Dec. 5, while the sculptural work of Julie Lichtenberg will be on display at the Wakeley Gallery through Nov. 17.

A gallery reception for both exhibitions will be held on Nov. 4 from 7 to 8:30 p.m. in the foyer of the IWU School of Art building.

Kemmerling will display her mixed media work consisting primarily of printmaking, photographic, and drawing materials. Her work incorporates cartographic symbols, which are her sources, and combines them with visual elements derived from her personal reaction to real and imaginary landscape and environmental situations.

Sikes, a Chicago artist, and Kellerman, a teacher at Northern Illinois University and recipient of a Ford Foundation Scholarship, will both display paintings on paper.

The sculptural works of Lichtenberg, a visiting artist at Wesleyan, deal with issues of isolation and loneliness.

The IWU galleries are open Monday through Friday from noon to 4 p.m., Tuesday from 7 to 9 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday from 1 to 4 p.m.
