BLOOMINGTON, Ill.-- The Illinois Wesleyan University School of Art will present its annual Faculty Art Exhibition in the Merwin Gallery, March 24 through April 22. There will be an opening reception on Thursday, March 24 between the hours of 7 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. Admission is free and open to the public.

Among the works presented in the show are:

- "Tsuki no Sakana," 1994, by Miles Bair, director of the school of art. An acrylic and metallic painting on a 38 inch x 48 inch canvas.
- "Tightrope," 1993, by Kevin Strandberg, associate professor of art. A mixed media and photograph display, which is 13 inches x 21 inches x 6 inches.
- "Sheltered Escape," 1993, by Ann Taulbee, associate professor of art. This piece uses color intaglio and chine colle, and measures 9 inches x 12 inches.
- "Saggar House," 1993, by Thomas Orr, visiting artist in ceramics. Ceramic and black granite, measuring12 inches x 20 inches x 13 inches.
- "Floating," 1994, by Sherilyn McElroy, assistant professor of art/graphic design. McElroy used a color computer print for this piece, which is 6 inches x 8.5 inches.

Merwin Gallery hours are Monday through Friday, 12 p.m. to 4 p.m., Tuesday, 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday, from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Note: The gallery will be closed from March 25 through April 3 for spring break.
