A ceramics show by students of Anna Calluori-Holcombe, instructor in art, will open at 7 p.m. Friday, Apr. 4, in the Margaret Wakeley Gallery at Illinois Wesleyan University.

The gallery, which is on the first floor of the School of Art building, will be open free to the public Friday and then during regular exhibition hours-- 1-4 p.m. Monday-Saturday, 7-9 p.m. Tuesday-Wednesday and 1-5 p.m. Sunday-- through Apr. 10.

An opening reception will be held from 7-9 p.m. Friday.

Each of the students, among them Dawn Ficca, 1919 E. Jackson, a sophomore art major, will exhibit at least one piece of work. Other students represented in the show include six who are nursing majors, plus majors in psychology, theatre and chemistry.

In addition, there will be an exhibit of ceramics pieces from the permanent art collection of the university plus some from the personal collection of Mrs. Holcombe. These pieces will be in the display case opposite the entrance to the gallery.
