Two members of the Illinois Wesleyan University faculty will take part in a workshop Monday and Tuesday at the National Conference of Science, Technology and Values at the Spring Hill Center, Wayzata, Minn.

In charge of a workshop on social and political life will be Dr. Jerry C. Israel, professor of history and director of social science programs.

Representing the humanist viewpoint, as contrasted to the scientific viewpoint, on the same program will be Dr. Karen G. Gervais, assistant professor of philosophy. A paper Mrs. Gervais wrote addressing the problems of value dilemmas to be faced in connection with scientific and technological advances in the next 20 years will serve as a basis for discussions at the workshop.

The conference opens Sunday and continues through Wednesday.
