Two Illinois Wesleyan University art education majors, Marty McKean and Pam Lotz, will share their senior art exhibits Apr. 28-May 6 in the Community Room of the Bloomington Public Library.

The show will be open free to the public from 9 a.m.-9 p.m. Monday-Thursday, 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Friday-Saturday and 1-5 p.m. Sunday. There will be an opening reception from 6-8 p.m. Monday.

Miss McKean's show will consist of approximately 20 black and white photographs, primarily of children, and a small collection of stoneware plates finished with various glazes.

Miss Lotz also will exhibit several black and white photographs which are people oriented. She also will include prints, etchings and woodcuts and two books which she printed on the Blackstock Press. One is a book of three Aesop fables which she illustrated. The other is an autobiography written by her grandmother.

Both students will seek employment as art teachers at the junior high and high school level following graduation in May.
