Dr. Carole Brandt, Director of the School of Drama, will be the featured speaker Wednesday, Sept. 9, at Illinois Wesleyan University's first all-school assembly, the annual President's Convocation.

The program, which will be open free to the public, will be at 11 a.m. in Presser Hall.

Ms. Brandt's topic will be "Everything Is Beautiful at the Ballet, or Whose Life Is It Anyway?"

The program also will include remarks by Dr. Robert S. Eckley, president of the university, who will assure the new students, "April Is Not the Cruelest Month," and Lynn Folse, senior English major from Springfield, who will speak as president of the student senate. Her topic will be "The Liberal Arts Egg: A Lesson in Relevance."

The Faculty Trio of Rico McNeela, violin, Robert Luke, cello, and Lawrence Campbell, piano, will play "Piano Trio in G, Opus 1, No. 2" by Beethoven.

Dr. William White, University Chaplain, will deliver the invocation.

Dr. David Gehrenbeck, associate professor of organ and sacred music, will play the prelude and postlude.
