During the day, these intermediate and advanced students, some of whom are non-art majors, will be demonstrating raku firing. This is a Japanese method of firing ceramics in which glazed pieces are pulled out of a kiln at 1,300 degrees and thrown into combustible materials to produce a smoked effect.

A variety of finished work, both functional and artistic, will be available for purchase.
