BLOOMINGTON, ILL.--Dr. David M. Gehrenbeck, associate professor of organ and sacred music at Illinois Wesleyan University, will play the dedicatory recital on a new three-manual Austin pipe organ at St. Paul United Church of Christ, 101 N. 8th St., Pekin.

The program at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 29, will include the St. Paul Choir, directed by Vivian Gerrietts, and the congregation will join in singing two hymns of the faith and the doxology.

Gehrenbeck, who served as consultant to the church, will play the premiere performance of a work composed by David Brunner, 1975 IWU graduate, plus works by Bach, Brahms, Mendelssohn, Hampton, Wesley and Vierne.

Gehrenbeck is organist-choirmaster of First United Methodist Church, Normal. He earned both master's and doctor's degrees in sacred music from Union Theological Seminary.
