Dr. Emil Kauder, 81, professor of economics at Illinois Wesleyan University from 1952-1961, died Thursday in Bayfront Hospital, St. Petersburg, Fla.

Mr. Kauder left Wesleyan to join the faculty of Eckherd College, then named Florida Presbyterian, in St. Petersburg, Fla. After retiring from the Eckherd faculty in 1968, he served on the faculty of the University of South Florida, Tampa, where he held the position of Distinguished Emeritus Professor in the School of Business Administration at the time of his death.

A memorial service will be held Wednesday at 11 a.m. in the St. Matthews Episcopal Church, St. Petersburg. He was cremated.

He was born in Berlin, Germany, June 23, 1901, and was educated in Germany, receiving a doctorate from the University of Berlin.
