BLOOMINGTON, ILL.--Dr. William L. White, Illinois Wesleyan University Chaplain, assisted by Dr. Karen Osborne, assistant professor of English, will lead a three-week trip to the Soviet Union July 26--Aug. 15.

While it is expected the group will be made up primarily of college students, the trip will be open to all interested persons. The fee includes airfare from New York, hotels, meals and sightseeing.

An informational meeting will be held at 7:30 p.m. Monday, Feb. 14, in the audio-visual auditorium of Sheean Library at Wesleyan.

White said present plans include five days each in Moscow and Leningrad with shorter visits to Kiev, Riga and Kishinev.

Travel arrangements will be handled through Citizen Exchange Council (CEC), a New York City agency with 20 years experience in Soviet-American exchanges. The council encourages person-to-person contacts with Soviet citizens; thus, the trip will be more than just a tourist adventure. There will be opportunities to talk to Soviet people, attend concerts and view firsthand the operation of selected Soviet institutions. White has participated in three other CEC visits to Russia in recent years.
