BLOOMINGTON, ILL.--Cal Pritner's one-man presentation of "Luther" will be performed at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Apr. 12, in Memorial Student Center at Illinois Wesleyan University.

The program, which will be sponsored by the Religious Life Committee of the IWU Student Senate, will be open free to the public.

The two-hour show, "Martin Luther: Apostle of Defiance," was written by Pritner's colleague in the theatre department at Illinois State University, John W. Kirk.

The show is described as being not only an historical accounting of the life of the religious scholar, but a provocative look inside the man "who struggled with the forces of the established church, as well as within himself."

This year marks the 500th anniversary of the birth of the German theologian who led the Protestant Reformation in Germany.
