

BLOOMINGTON, ILL.--A paper by Dr. Robert Leh, associate professor of political science at Illinois Wesleyan University, has been accepted for publication in the World Academy of Development and Cooperation's Monograph Series on Global Development.

"Creating Client-States: Aid, Arms and Tension" is the title of the paper. The series will be published before the end of 1984. Leh, a member of the Wesleyan faculty since 1966, also has been named one of the Academy's eight External Research Fellows.

Located in College Park, Md., the Academy is a nonprofit research, training, research promotion, documentation and publication organization dedicated to promotion of global development, cooperation and peace.
