Dr. Jerry D. Durham, assistant professor of nursing at Illinois Wesleyan University, is the co-author of an article in the July/August issue of Journal of Continuing Education in Nursing.

Judith Cattron of the University of Illinois College of Nursing is co-author of the article, "Hypertension Education: A Summative Evaluation of Direct and Indirect Care Providers' Knowledge, Roles, and Attitudes." The article focuses upon research on learning and behavior changes of nurses after their participation in a continuing education program.

Durham, who joined the Wesleyan faculty in 1983, participated in a National Endowment for the Humanities Summer Seminar for College Teachers June 18-Aug. 10 at the University of Maryland at College Park.
