BLOOMINGTON, ILL.--James Clarage, Jr., son of James and Helenjo Clarage, RR 5, Lockport, was named recipient of the Anderson Physic Scholarship at Illinois Wesleyan University.

The announcement Wednesday (Sept. 12) was made by University President Dr. Robert S. Eckley during the President's Convocation.

The scholarship was established in 1982 by Illinois Wesleyan alumnus and former trustee Scott Anderson to provide full or partial tuition to a physics major of outstanding scholarship and character.

A 1935 graduate, Anderson is the founder and president of Anderson Physics Laboratories, Inc. Champaign. He holds master's and doctor's degrees from the University of Illinois. He served as trustee from 1958-76. He was president of the Alumni Association in 1956-57. He was awarded an honorary Doctor of Science degree from Wesleyan in 1960 and received the Distinguished Alumnus Award in 1980. He is a member of the President's Club, Chapel Committee, Board of Visitors and Science Advisory Committee.

Clarage has been a regular member of the Dean's List for academic excellence with a cumulative grade point average of 3.86 on a scale of 4.0. He is a member of and served as president of Society of Physics Students; Green Medallion, local activities honorary; and Phi Eta Sigma, national scholastic honorary for freshman men.

Clarage will graduate in May 1985 with a double major, physics and mathematics. He also has a strong interest in philosophy.
