BLOOMINGTON, ILL.--Exhibitions of wooden sculptures, ceramics and drawings, and collages and lithographs will open at 1 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 30, in the Merwin and Wakeley galleries at Illinois Wesleyan University.

There will be a reception at 7 p.m. Tuesday for both shows, which will be open free to the public from 1-4 p.m. daily and 7-9 p.m. Tuesdays through Dec. 14.

In the Merwin Gallery will be works by Larry Calhoun, chairman of the art department at MacMurray College. He has shown extensively throughout the Midwest, including the Gilman Gallery in Chicago.

Calhoun will exhibit ceramics, linear wooden sculptures of about 5 to 6 feet in height, plus pencil, ink and paint drawings of recognizable images that are combined with abstract markings.

The Wakeley Gallery will contain the collages and lithographs of Darryl V. Storrs, who holds a graduate degree from the University of Massachusetts.

She will show small, but brilliantly colored landscapes and collages of fragments of landscapes.
