BLOOMINGTON, ILL.--Donna Hartweg, assistant professor of nursing at Illinois Wesleyan University, has been elected Nov. 9 to a two-year term on the Board of Directors of the Illinois Nurses' Association, a constituent of the American Nurses' Association.
