Kathryn Kerr and Sandra Steingraber, poets whose interests in science are reflected in their works, will present a program in the Art Gallery at Illinois Wesleyan University Monday (April 11) at 7:30 p.m. The program will be open free to the public.

Both are featured in the new Benchmark anthology of emerging Illinois poets, which was edited by Dr. James McGowan and Dr. Lynn DeVore, both of the IWU faculty.

Ms. Steingraber graduated from IWU in 1981 with a bachelor of arts degree in biology, received a master's degree in creative writing at Illinois State University and is finishing a doctorate in ecology at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.

Ms. Kerr resides in Sidney and is the author of First Frost, a collection of poems published by Stormline Press. She received a bachelor's degree in English from Southern Illinois University and a master's in botany from Eastern Illinois University. She is especially interested in the disappearing plant life of the Illinois prairie.
