BLOOMINGTON, ILL.--The Illinois Wesleyan University School of Art will host sculptor Ralph DiCapua, assistant professor at the University of Connecticut-Storrs Monday-Thursday, Oct. 20-23.

DiCapua will present an exhibition in the Merwin Gallery Oct. 20-Nov. 21 and will be a visiting artist Oct. 20-23. During his visit he will be creating sculptures in the Wakeley Gallery.

He will be guest of honor at a reception at 7 p.m. Oct. 23.

The exhibit will be open free to the public from 1-4 p.m. daily and 7-9 p.m. Tuesday.

Earlier this year, he was visiting lecturer at Salem (MA) State University and Manchester (CT) Community College. He has exhibited widely throughout the Northeast.

DiCapua received a summer fellowship and a research foundation grant from the University of Connecticut this year in addition to being nominated for a National Award for the Visual Arts.
