- Performing over 120 concerts per year across the U.S., Canada, and Australia, Lavin is not only musically talented, but also entertains her audiences by telling stories, twirling glowing batons, and using a digital phrase sampler to improvise lyrics.
- Lavin has been the recipient of the NAIRD award, two New York Music Awards, four ASCAP composer awards, the Kate Wolf Memorial Award, and the 2001 Backstage Bistro Award for Outstanding New York Singer-Songwriter of the Year.
